Oregon's public record and meetings laws: 1,2

- Notice: Notice of meetings of the study group will be publicized as for other city advisory committees: Published in local newspapers, on city's calendar of community events, etc.
- Materials: Materials for meetings of the study group will be available to the public on a website.
- Minutes: Detailed minutes of study group meetings need not be maintain. But summary
 notes that include major conclusions or recommendations with who voted how should be
 maintained, approved at following meetings, and made available to the public.
- Public testimony: Each meeting of the study group will provide a time for public comments, in general at the end of each meeting, except when a major decision is scheduled comments should occur before such decision.
- Public comments: There will be a mechanism for the study group to receive written comments, via email, website and/or postal mail, and such comments shall be included in materials for each meeting.
